 - a. Earth Day Celebration Disscusion, Pallavi Pokharel
 - i. Pallavi Pokharel introduced herself as the Sustainability Manager for ISU, who joined in September, presented plans for an upcoming event to celebrate sustainability and integrate sustainable practices into campus life. The Earth Day Forum will be held on April 22nd as part of a week-long celebration of Earth Week, which includes multiple side events. The forum will feature panel discussions and keynote speakers on topics such as Earth and mental health, student engagement in sustainability, student submissions and academic research, and ecology and landscaping. Other topics will include campus dining practices, seasonal recycling initiatives, facilities management, new energy initiatives, public transportation accessibility, and the strengths and feasibility of transit options. An awareness campaign and competitions are planned leading up to the event, and a pop-up thrift store will also be included. There has been significant collaboration and communication to gain momentum for the event. The Sustainability Manager encouraged feedback, ideas, or suggestions, noting that sustainability is a shared responsibility.
