VI. GALLERY QUESTION AND ANSWER

- a. Effie Hernandez, the Native American Student Services Coordinator shared that Idaho State University will host its 7th Annual Indigenous Peoples' Day Celebration on Monday, October 13, 2025, at the Pond Student Union Building. Coordinated by the Native American Student Coordinator, the event features a variety of activities including presentations from Indigenous community members, traditional storytelling, and stone tool making, with many other engaging opportunities throughout the day. Attendees can also participate in door prize giveaways from 20 participating vendors. This celebration, themed Indigenous Joy: Celebrating Strength & Resilience, offers the campus and local community a meaningful chance to come together to honor the rich cultures, histories, and ongoing contributions of Indigenous peoples, making it a special occasion to celebrate everyone on campus.
- b. Emily Jones, a member of Idaho State University's Greek Life and Greek Council, noted that many Greek life representatives are present tonight to show their support for the multicultural fraternities and sororities on campus, specifically highlighting Lambda Theta Alpha. She emphasized to the Senate that all multicultural organizations on campus are a tremendous asset to both Greek life and the broader campus community as a whole.

VIII. PRESIDENT REPORT

a. President Halter shared that last week's Student Leader Social was a success, with 45 student leaders in attendance. He, along with Senator Saunders and Director Burrell, discussed the possibility of making Benny's Pantry a permanent line item in the ASISU budget. He also thanked the students who attended the recent tailgate event, despite the rain, and recognized the other student organizations that helped make it possible. Looking ahead, the Homecoming tailgate is expected to be even bigger. Spirit Week is also happening this upcoming week, and there will be daily prize opportunities promoted through the ASISU Instagram page.
