- VII. ANNOUNCEMENTS AND CORRESPONDENCE
 - Rural ROAR Club New Club, Jordyn Jones; Val Davids Student Leadership and Engagement Center Coordinator
 - i. Val Davids shared that according to the Idaho Department of Labor, as of May 2025, the classification of Idaho's counties has remained unchanged since 2003. Out of the state's 44 counties, 35 are still classified as rural, highlighting the significant rural demographic in Idaho. She also shared that the purpose of this organization is to establish support and belonging among rural students, assist them in adjusting to college life, promote self-development, provide social connections, and equip members with valuable skills and resources.
 - ii. Both the President and Vice President shared that this club aims to bring together students from rural communities and provide a welcoming environment to reduce loneliness among incoming students. They plan to create activities based in Pocatello, such as fly fishing, offering a diverse experience not only for Idaho students but for all students interested in rural life. The club's goal is to unite rural students, offering a space where they can attend events together, feel less

overwhelmed, and build connections with peers who share similar backgrounds. In one day tabling for this club, they successfully recruited 16 members.

- Senator Vargas Barbosa noted that within the College of Arts & Letters, there is a
 program with goals similar to this club and offered to help connect the club with that
 department.
 - The Rural Roar members confirmed they are already in contact with that department and plan to continue utilizing that resource.

VIII. PRESIDENT REPORT

a. President Halter shared that Spirit Week is happening this week with ASISU. While participation has been limited, they've received some valuable feedback from students on how to improve future events.
 Homecoming is next week, with many activities to get involved in, including the ASISU tailgate on October 25th. President Halter also praised the Hispanic Heritage Month event and thanked Senator Vargas Barvosa for coordinating it.

a. Senate Pro Tempore Committee, Senator Smith

- i. Senator Smith shared that he has been working with President Halter to organize an ASISU Lunch with the Deans, planned for early December. Additionally, he is helping coordinate a recurring monthly Lunch with ASISU/HeySISU event to provide ongoing opportunities for student engagement and feedback.
- b. Finance Committee, Senator Saunders
 - Senator Saunders shared that there is work being done to update the internal funding request
 process and procedures. In committee today, the First Gen Students Club presented a request for
 \$2,000 to fund a dinner event for the last of First-Generation Celebration week. The African
 Student Association also presented a funding request for \$800, which was approved.
- c. Senate Rules and Appointments Committee, Senator Smith
 - i. Senator Smith shared that this committee it releasing Bill 623 and requesting that when we reach that line item, we move to committee for further discussion.
- d. Student Involvement Committee, Senator Van Metre
 - i. Senator Van Metre shared that Spirit Week participation has been low and more involvement is needed. As Senators, there is an expectation to actively participate so that students can see ASISU engaged, which encourages their participation as well. For the Homecoming tailgate on October 25th there are two set up plans. Plan A is to set up all ASISU tents the night before, weather permitting and if allowed. Plan B is to bring everything to the tailgate area the morning of the event and set up immediately after the Homecoming parade. Participation from everyone in ASISU is needed since Greek life may not be helping at this tailgate due to their involvement in the Homecoming Parade. It is important for the Senate to be involved and assist with the setup. She also shared that Theresa Brissette sent a mass email to all clubs inviting them to join and participate in the tailgate. She is working on securing a DJ and coordinating with ICCU to bring the Green Mobile Truck to the tailgate as well.
