

The ASISU Election Code was updated November 19, 2014, to add paragraph F; clarify voting options for students who have more than one major. The Voting Procedures section of the Election Code is shown below.

ELECTION CODE

ARTICLE III—MECHANICS OF ELECTION

SECTION 2—VOTING PROCEDURES

- A. Students may vote online from a computer of their choice throughout the entire voting period.
- B. Online voting shall include a system to verify that the individual is an ISU student and pays the ASISU fee and Student Activities fee. The online system shall include safeguards against voting more than once and shall provide adequate safeguards to avoid election fraud. The commission shall determine the adequacy of online voting safeguards.
- C. Paper ballots shall be available upon request in the ASISU office.
- D. Accessing the online voting database shall be prohibited during the voting period.
- E. In the event of a computer system failure or compromise of the election system as verifiable by the system administrator, the election will commence on the repair of the computer system. The time will be determined by the commission.
- F. Students who have more than one major and wish to vote in a different college than what appears on their online ballot may request a paper ballot in the ASISU office. The Elections Commission shall verify that the student's major falls under the college he/she wishes to vote for.

Students who do not see the college they wish to vote for in their ASISU Voting Channel should not cast an online vote. Students are required to come to the ASISU office (Room 207 in the Pond Student Union Building) to receive a paper ballot. They will be asked to provide their name and/or Bengal ID number to office staff (on behalf of the Elections Commission) to verify 1) eligibility to vote and 2) their major for a college other than the Banner designated college shown on their MyISU portal.

Outreach campus students unable to come to the ASISU office during voting days should contact election@isu.edu to learn where they may place a paper ballot.

Once the student receives their paper ballot, they may vote. The student will then be asked to fold their paper ballot and staple it closed. The paper ballot will be placed in a locked box to be opened by the Elections Commission when votes are tallied after 5:00 PM on March 8th. Paper ballots from outreach campuses will be sent to the ASISU Office.

During election tabulation, the names and/or Bengal ID's (which do not appear on individual ballots) will be submitted to Information Technology Services (ITS) for verification that no online vote was cast. If the student has submitted an online vote, their paper ballot will be disallowed.
