

# National, Regional and University Recognitions

- Dr. Barbara Kornblau selected by HHS Secretary Becerra to serve on the National Advisory Committee on Individuals with Disabilities and Disasters
- Dr. Dani Moffit was inducted into the Northwest Athletic Trainers' Association Hall of Fame for her untiring efforts in service to the Athletic Training profession, educational organization, and diversity, equity and inclusion in health care. She is the first woman in Idaho to receive this honor.

# *Our People*

- 8 faculty receiving clinical promotion or promotion and/or tenure
- Professional fees approved to support college infrastructure and programs

- Community service:
  - \$137,458 in free care provided to 2986 community members by Dental Hygiene
  - SON students provided 11,000 hours of service to support health
  - Hundreds of hours of community and health services by MLS
  - 875 community service hours provided by PA students

# Grants in Support of Our Students' Education

- \$2.1 million from US Dept. of Ed to train health care interpreters
- \$1.4 million HRSA Grit grant to support training of rural health PA's
- \$10 million planned
- gift to support PA education
- 2<sup>nd</sup> year of \$1 million Clinical Rehab. Counseling Student Training Grant

# Our Programs

- Graduated first cohort of DPT students from Meridian location
- Undergraduate Community and Public Health student completed practicum at the Shosone-Bannock tribe and selected for Peace Corps
- Student Capstone research accepted for publication in the journal of Nutrition and Health
- MOT program expanded to Meridian (32 students accepted); 2 faculty/2 student groups at national conference
- Authorization to expand audiology clinical services
