Spring 2018–2025
As a clinical supervisor, I have facilitated interdisciplinary evaluations through the CSD 4417/5517 course, supervising graduate students as they partnered with professionals from Occupational Therapy, Psychology, and other allied health disciplines. Each student participated in team-based evaluations and formal staffing meetings involving up to 10 disciplines. This hands-on experience fostered interprofessional collaboration, client-centered care planning, and clinical competency in managing complex cases.
- **LINCOLN Preschool Group (Interprofessional Clinical Experience)**
Fall 2017–2019, 2023
I co-developed and coordinated an interprofessional clinical experience at a local preschool in collaboration with Dr. Bryan Gee from ISU's Occupational Therapy (OT) program. This initiative brought together OT and SLP graduate students (all 2nd years) to deliver weekly 30-minute push-in group therapy sessions, followed by a structured 45-minute debrief and teaching component. The experience emphasized collaborative service delivery, early intervention, and functional assessment, while promoting interprofessional communication and clinical reasoning.
- **VOICE Clinic (Graduate Clinical Supervision)**
January–May 2017
I supervised the implementation of a specialized clinical practicum focused on

social communication therapy for developmentally delayed young adults (ages 18–21). Graduate students conducted weekly one-hour individual therapy sessions targeting functional social and language and communication goals. This clinic offered a unique opportunity to build expertise in social communication and language disorders within a nontraditional and underserved population.
