SCHOOL COUNSELING LEADING TO THE DEGREE MASTER OF COUNSELING (M.COUN)

The Masters of Counseling specialty practice area in School Counseling is designed to prepare counselors with the skills needed to provide counseling, consulting, and comprehensive guidance services in elementary and secondary school settings.

A. **General Residency Requirement.** For the Master of Counseling (M.COUN.) specialty practice area, the student is required to complete the equivalent of at least four full semesters of resident graduate study beyond the bachelor's degree. The minimum School Counseling program must total 60 semester hours.
