1. Vertical Credits

Jasun Carr, Chair of the Department of Global Studies and Languages, has sent ASC a list of ISU's peer institutions with their policies on vertical (also known as retroactive) credits. 2. Transcript Access

Faculty at ISU currently do not have access to transcripts for the students in their classes, but some Idaho institutions such as the University of Idaho do allow this access. ASC will review the pros and cons of ISU's current policy on this question. In cases where faculty can review their students' transcripts, they usually must pass a FERPA training session like the ones we currently enroll in for cybersecurity. 3. Update on Academic Integrity Council and Question of AI

As we discussed in our September meeting, the Academic Integrity Council (AIC) is now available to faculty and students. It has emphasized the need for faculty across campus to be especially aware of the presence of AI in student work and state clearly on course syllabi their policy on AI, as students are encountering a spectrum of attitudes toward it among their instructors.
