

Applied Behavior Analysis and Behavior Management Course Syllabus

Course Description

This course aims to equip professionals with the knowledge and practical skills necessary to understand, analyze, and modify behavior using Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA). It will cover the definition of behavior, principles of ABA and how to apply the techniques, types of behavior, components of ABA, functions of behavior, and ethical considerations. It also delves into ABA techniques, including antecedent interventions, behavior observation and measurement, task analysis, discrete trial training and natural environment teaching. The application of ABA techniques are illustrated through case studies and real-world examples, positive behavior support strategies, and evidence-based interventions.

This course enhances classroom teaching effectiveness and supports improved student outcomes by introducing new knowledge in Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA), focusing on behavior principles, evidence-based interventions, and practical strategies for behavior modification.
