

Creating an Effective Co-Teaching Classroom Course Syllabus

Course Description

The purpose of this professional development course is to learn about and engage with Co-Teaching concepts and practices to gain a meaningful understanding of the teaching approach. Co-Teaching is much more than two or more teachers in a room. It is a systematic approach to education that seeks to engage all students and provides opportunities for all to learn and access content in the general education classroom. Unless practical training and/or education takes place, many feel underqualified and overwhelmed with the idea of teaching in a classroom with two or more teachers. This course is meant to alleviate all those concerns by learning the process of co-teaching through informed content explorations that will prepare individuals for a more conducive co-teaching environment.

This course enhances classroom teaching effectiveness and supports improved student outcomes by introducing new knowledge in co-teaching concepts, practices, and collaborative instructional strategies.

Course Objectives

- 1. Describe the origins, characteristics, myths and perceptions of co-teaching.
- 2. Identify the benefits and the challenges of co-teaching expressed by students and parents.
- 3. Describe effective co-teaching collaboration and communication strategies.
- 4. Analyze and differentiate the six approaches to co-teaching and assess Team and Alternative Teaching in detail.
- 5. Identify and explain the co-teaching approaches of Parallel, Station, One Teach/One Assist, and One Teach/One Observe.
- 6. Identify other potential co-teachers to bring in the classroom and how to utilize them.
- 7. Describe effective administrative support for co-teaching.
- 8. Apply best practices towards planning, communication, surviving and thriving as a co-teaching pair.
