Course Description

The purpose of this professional development course is to provide educators with essential knowledge and practical strategies to support neurodivergent learners in elementary classrooms. Course Objectives

2. Recognize and support students who have or may have ADHD/ADD.
3. Recognize and support students who have or may have Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD).
4. Recognize and support students who have or may have learning disabilities.
5. Recognize and support students who have or may have Tourette.
6. Recognize and support students who have or may have sensory processing issues.
7. Understand strategies to communicate with neurodivergent learners.
8. Inspire educators to advocate for systemic changes to better support neurodiverse students.
