Course Syllabus

Course Description

This course is ideal for educators, administrators, and anyone interested in the history and philosophy of education, aiming to apply these insights to enhance their professional practice and influence future educational developments.

This course enhances classroom teaching effectiveness and supports improved student outcomes by introducing new knowledge in the history and philosophy of education, exploring key educational theories, influential philosophers, and the evolution of educational practices from past to present.

8. Predict emerging issues and their impact on future educational models, practices, and philosophies.
