Trauma Informed Classroom

Course Syllabus

Course Description

Every year children enter classrooms with a higher likelihood of childhood trauma. Incarceration, divorce, abuse of all forms, and children's mental health issues are just the tip of the iceberg of trauma that teachers are dealing with on a daily basis in their classrooms. In this course, participants will learn to identify various traumas that affect learners in today's classrooms. Participants will learn to develop specific behavior strategies and plans to help learners suffering from childhood trauma, so they can be successful learners in the classroom. This course is geared toward Tier 2 and 3 level behaviors in the RTI process.

This course enhances classroom teaching effectiveness and supports improved student outcomes by introducing new knowledge in how to recognize signs of trauma in children, implement trauma-informed classroom strategies, and create a supportive classroom environment that promotes student success and educator well-being.
