The current 23 balance is \$10,347.32. 24 25 **New Business:** 26 1. Ombuds Program 27 28 Brian Sagendorf spoke about the expanded Ombuds Program. The university has used the Ombuds Program 29 for faculty as an informal problem resolution process. The president has asked that the Ombuds Program 30 be expanded for all employees. The program is voluntary and is not part of the formal grievance process. A 31 formal grievance may filed after speaking to an ombuds. 32 33 The program will have a broad network of ombuds contacts. It will consist of faculty and staff, and will be 34 gender and ethnically diverse. Stacey Marshall will coordinate the program. Stacey will solicit volunteer 35 nominations. Those nominations will be reviewed by Affirmative Action, HR, and respective VPs. Successful 36 nominations will be appointed by the president. Stacey will provide training for appointed ombuds. 37 38 The anticipated start of the program is September 2015. HR is hoping that selection, training, and 39 orientation of the Ombuds Committee will occur over the summer semester. Initially the appointment will 40 be for two years with an annual review. There will be no limit to the committee's size. Ombuds may be 41 selected from outreach campuses. 42 43 2. Merit Increases 44 45 Syd asked Brian to explain what the State Board of Education approved for merit increases this year. Brian explained, as a directive from the legislature, any time there are merit dollars to distribute, agencies are to 46 47 develop a merit matrix. The merit matrix takes into account the performance rating and compa-ratio. The 48 compa-ratio is what the pay rate currently is compared to the midpoint of the pay grade. 49 50 This year there is a 3% pool of merit dollars. For classified staff, employees below the midpoint of their pay 51 grade will receive the following increases: 52 a. Meets expectations – 2%

b. Exceeds expectations – 3%

c. Consistently exceeds or Excellent – 4%

 If the staff member is above the midpoint of their pay grade, they will receive the following increases:

- a. Meets expectations 1%
- b. Exceeds expectations 2%
- c. Consistently exceeds or Excellent 3%

Non-classified staff and faculty do not have a pay grade structure so they will not receive increases based on a merit matrix. ISU also has an equity pool of money that will be used to close market and gender equity gaps.
