Honors Thesis Spotlight:

Jaden Palmer



Utilizing Physics-Informed Synthetic Data to Predict Reactor Operations

Jaden Palmer '25, is an ambitious and busy guy. He's the current UHP Club President, a UHP Peer Mentor, Vice President of the ISU American Nuclear Society, an Intern at Idaho National Laboratory (INL), and a student researcher at the ISU Measurement & Control Engineering Research Center (MCERC). Along with all of that, Jaden will graduate in May with an Honors B.S. in Nuclear Engineering and a B.S. in Mechanical Engineering with a minor in Physics.

Jaden has been working at the Idaho National Laboratory (INL) for the past two years and his Honors Thesis is based on the work he has been doing at INL with Dr. Ryan Stewart. Jaden is grateful to former honors director, Dr. Shannon Kobs Nawotniak, who helped him connect with INL scientists and led to his employment there.

Jaden's research is intense. "The goal of this work is to determine how synthetic data can be used to train a recurrent neural network model for predicting the reactor power of the AGN-201. This approach will help bridge the gap between the virtual and physical sides of a digital twin, where reactor physics models based on as-built data can be corrected for actual operating parameters to ensure the virtual model mirrors reality." This involves collecting data from nuclear reactors and using it to put into neural networks to train virtual reactors, which means he's spent a lot of time in the computer lab. Here's his <u>full abstract</u>, if you're interested in learning more.

Jaden likes to keep his plate full and loves the work he does, but he'll take a break now and then. "When I am not working on schoolwork or research, I enjoy playing chess, fishing, and hanging out with friends, family, and my dog."

Jaden is headed to North Carolina State University to pursue a Ph.D. in Nuclear Engineering. "I will be developing digital twins and reduced order models for nuclear non-proliferation studies of advanced nuclear reactors." We asked him if he has any tips for incoming honors students who are interested in undergraduate research. Jaden says, "Be proactive. Professors and faculty generally gauge how successful students will be in research not by their initial competence, but by how motivated and passionate the students are about that research. Research is something that anyone can do successfully, you just have to find what you truly enjoy doing and work hard at it."

North American Language and Culture Assistants Program (NALCAP)



The North American Language and Culture Assistants Program (NALCAP). American college students and graduates - who are native-like speakers of English - partner with elementary and secondary schools in Spain to bolster language programs, as language assistants (TAs) under the supervision and guidance of teachers in Spain.

NALCAP falls under the category of public diplomacy programs. As a language assistant, you will be fulfilling the role of a cultural ambassador as you advance English language learning and mutual understanding through cultural exchange.

As such, your role is to encourage students of all ages in Spain to broaden their knowledge of your language and culture.

Placements are offered across Spain, in practically every city and town in the country, running from October 1st to May 31st for most assignments. NALCAP recipients teach 14 to 16 hours per week and receive a monthly stipend along with medical insurance.

NALCAP offers recipients the opportunity to immerse themselves in the language and culture of Spain while sharing the language and culture of the United States with students in Spain, as well as a tremendous opportunity for professional and personal growth.


