Honors Student Employment Opportunities!

We are seeking Honors students who are interested in on-campus employment. You must be work-study eligible (this would be indicated in your financial aid documentation) or CPI eligible (www.isu.edu/career/cpi-program/). If you are eligible, any of these positions would be excellent experiences for your future at ISU and beyond.

Work Study Positions

(up to 15 hours a week)

Honors Coordination Assistant

The position entails administrative, internal recordkeeping, and organizational tasks that support University Honors Program operations. Specific duties will rotate throughout the academic year. The Honors Coordination Assistant will report directly to UHP leadership.

Academic Affairs Assistant

The position entails support for offices within Academic Affairs, including the Bengal Student Success Center and the Center for Learning and Instructional Excellence. The Academic Affairs Student Assistant will report directly to leadership in Academic Affairs.

Career Path Intern (CPI) Positions (variable hours per week)

Writing & Editorial CPI

The position entails writing and editorial work for the 2026 edition of "Honors in Perspective" magazine. Duties will include interviewing UHP students and leadership, writing articles, and copyediting. Applicants should have some writing, journalism, or editorial experience. The Honors in Perspective CPI will report directly to UHP Leadership.

Photography & Design CPI

The position entails photography and design work for the 2026 edition of "Honors in Perspective" magazine. Duties will include setting up photography sessions with interviewees, magazine design, and copyediting. Applicants should have photography and design experience (specifically Adobe InDesign). The Honors in Perspective CPI will report directly to UHP Leadership.
