Eligibility

- Be a citizen or permanent resident of the United States (or provide documentation of intent to become a permanent resident)
- Be at least seventeen years old
- Express a desire to enroll in an adult education program or a program of postsecondary education
- Veterans eligible at any age, provided all other criteria are met




